Thanks for purchasing this SceneMaster kit. Please take a few minutes to study the drawings and read these instructions before starting construction - if you're unsure how parts go together, test-fit them before gluing. All parts are styrene so use compatible glue and paint to assemble and finish your model; you may find it easier to assemble and paint larger parts as subassemblies, while smaller parts may be painted on the sprue and touched-up after final installation.

As mail carriers began handling more packages, newspapers and similar large items in the late 1800s, small mailboxes proved unworkable in cities and rural areas. Large round-top boxes made especially for packages appeared in cities during the 1890s, and were joined by bigger tunnel-style mailboxes along country routes in 1915. With minor changes in colors and markings over the years, both styles are still in use today. Perfect for steam-, transition- and modern-era scenes, your new models can be used as free-standing details, or outside the Cornerstone® United States Post Office (#933-3782), Trackside Post Office (#933-4063) or Brick Post Office (#933-4200) kits, each sold separately. Standard Large Box

Align pins on Back (4) with openings in Standard Front (2) and glue where parts meet.

Drive-up Large Box

Align pins on Back (4) with openings in Extended Front (3) and glue where parts meet.
